

COURSE TITLE	<p align="center">MANUAL METAL ARC (MMA) WELDING- (CITY&GUILDS 3268 LEVEL 2)</p>
COURSE AIM	<p>This course is designed for those determined to obtain a qualification to enter the industry with enough skills to produce simple welded joints in non-complex positions and also for those that want a qualification for their own personal requirements.</p> <p>This course provides progression across a range of welding processes and also progression to higher levels.</p>
COURSE CONTENTS	<p>Students learn to produce single-run and multiple-run welds in the positions specified above with specific requirements to intermitted restart of weld.</p> <p>MODULE 1 – Production of Industry Standard Weld Joints (50 hours)</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Weld butt welds in the flat position 2. Weld multiple-run tee fillet in the horizontal/vertical position 3. Weld lap fillet welds in the vertical-up position 4. Weld tee fillet welds in the vertical-up position 5. Weld butt welds in the vertical-up position <p>MODULE 2 - Explore Technological Manual Metal Arc Welding Knowledge (10 hours)</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Health and Safety issues at the place of work when working with Manual Metal Arc Welding equipment 2. Working with others 3. Manual Metal Arc Welding process specific requirements 4. Manual Metal Arc basic destructive test requirements
DURATION	<p>60 hrs of guided learning course. Students need to invest further hours in the course, which will include private study and home assignments.</p>
SCHEDULE	<p>Twice a week between 5.30pm and 8.00pm or on Saturdays, between 8.00am and 1.00pm, or 1.30pm to 6.30pm</p>
